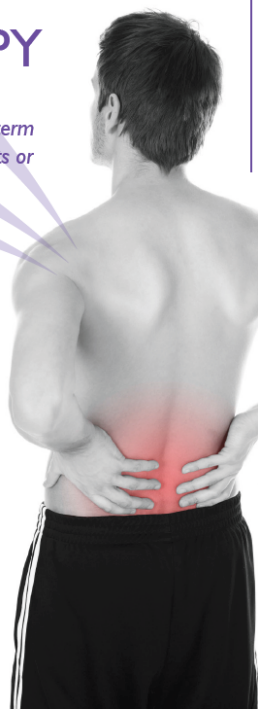

A new term - a new council. OK so most of the councillors are the same hard working volunteers! I would like to thank Dee Dillistone for all the work she has done for the council and the village and welcome Peter Bennett from Studley Road to the parish council. I look forward to working with Peter and the team over the coming months. At present we have two vacancies, so if anyone is interested in learning more about the parish council and what is involved in being a parish councillor, please let the clerk know.

The aim of the parish council is to represent the people of the village. To do this we need YOU the residents of Wootton to help us.

What new facilities does the village need?

What should be improved?

If the parish council has the powers to take something forward it can – if there is enough village support. If it

doesn't have the powers, it can lobby other organisations – again if there is enough support.

That support can be in a number of ways – a petition is one example. The skate park started with a petition and was followed by consultation evenings open to everyone. Feedback from those evenings was then considered and a decision made – this can work for other potential projects. We always need volunteers to work with us – collecting ideas and signatures for example. So far, road safety and speeding are giving people concern, but to move anything forward we need your help. If you can, please let the clerk know.

The regeneration project at Keeley End Pond is now underway. The parish council is working with the lower school and the aim is to design and plant an area that will attract a variety of British wildlife. This is not a quick project and we will be working on this over the next year or two.

Within the next 12 months we should see development starting at Fields Road South and opposite the Upper School. I am hoping the double-mini roundabout and pedestrian crossing at Fields Road, Bedford Road, Cranfield Road and Church Road will also start this year.

I would like to remind everyone that on Saturday 11 July, the Annual Fun Day will be on the recreational ground from 12 noon. As well as the usual stalls, music and games we are also having live music from 4pm until 9pm – please check the centre page for more information.

Finally we do receive calls from parishioners about anti-social behaviour, noise and dogs on the recreational ground. These crimes should be reported, but to the correct authority.

Only by working together can we make Wootton a great place.

Parish Clerk's Report

I'm pleased to say we had a very successful Annual Parish Meeting this year (1st April) with lots of village and local organisations attending. Thank you to all who did – it was very interesting to learn what had taken place over the previous 12 months and plans for the next 12. This meeting is open to all and a great opportunity to let people know what's happening on their own doorstep. Draft minutes and written reports are available on our website.

The elections came and went. At parish council level this was an uncontested election – 13 candidates put themselves forward. With 15 seats at stake, all were automatically elected. The role of parish councillor is voluntary and all give of their time freely. All members live within the village. If you would like more information on what's involved in grass-roots local government do please let me know. There are 2 vacancies at present.

I was asked some time ago to consider adding more information in the newsletter about projects and outstanding issues the parish council is either working on, or lobbying others about. Good idea – that can be found elsewhere in the newsletter. Apologies if anything has been missed at this stage – it's a new concept and will be updated ahead of each edition.

I have also received a number of phone calls and emails regarding incidents of anti-social behaviour which have taken place (mostly, but not all, within the recreation ground). I'm happy to report these incidents to the police on 101 – but by the time I'm aware, those responsible are usually long gone. PLEASE call it in too at the earliest opportunity – if there are patrols in the area they will attend. I have been speaking with Inspector Russell Goldsmith (5493) about recent incidents and the police can issue a dispersal order – this gives officers and PCSO's powers to arrest. The more calls they receive, the greater the opportunity to stop this. 101 is the **first** number to call.

Jake's Day Presents is a local music festival that started as a memorial to Jake Andrew Cleverly, a young, local lad that lost a very short battle with an incredibly rare blood disorder.

Jake had TTP (Thrombotic Thrombocytopenic Purpura), a blood disorder that causes clots to form in small blood vessels around the body. Jake sadly passed away only 1 week after first seeing a doctor but, if it hadn't been for Addenbrooke's and the phenomenal care that they provided, it's unlikely that he would have managed the week that he did.

Every year since Jake passed, the Cleverlys would hold an evening of food and drink at their house in remembrance of Jake. This has now escalated into two full days of live music, entertainment, stalls, attractions and entertainment for the whole family.

As of 2013 this has been done in full conjunction with Addenbrooke's Charitable Trust (ACT) and turned our little remembrance evening into a huge event that is only getting bigger. Last year we managed to present a cheque to ACT for £5,000. combine this with our first year and that total hits £7,500!

This year's event is set to be absolutely amazing. With over twenty bands and acts confirmed covering every genre imaginable, this is one not to be missed. On the 4th and 5th of July this year The Red Lion in Wilstead will be transformed from gentle village pub into the epicentre of live music and family fun. Wootton Vale Healthy Living Centre

The practice continues to grow steadily and we are fast approaching the 5,000 patient mark! This is very good news as the government seems to prefer larger practices who are able to offer a greater range of services to their patients.

We are pleased to report another very successful year in terms of our clinical performance. We achieved 99.9% on the Quality and Outcomes Framework (QOF), the system by which GP practices are assessed to ensure that they are providing good clinical care to their patients.

We have also reduced the rates of inappropriate A&E and emergency attendances of our patients at hospital. This is important as this also gives us an indication of the standard of care we offer and the fact that our patients are able to access our services rather than needing to use other services such as the hospital or Walk-in Centre. These options should not be used when the practice is able to provide the services, as they are far more inconvenient and generally involve far longer waiting times.

Staff News

It has been sad to see the departures of Dr Richards and Dr Islam. Dr Richards was finding it increasingly difficult to balance his responsibilities as the Chief Executive of the MK Urgent Care Centre with being a GP in a busy GP practice and decided to resign from the practice. Dr Islam left to go to on a sabbatical to Australia. We are hoping that he may re-join us when he returns to the UK.

Rosemary, from the Admin team, decided to retire to enjoy her favourite pastime – playing golf and to spend more time with her family. She will be sadly missed as she was one of our original Reception/Administration Team and, as such, was extremely popular with our patients. We would like to wish Rosemary a long and happy retirement. Rosemary has been replaced by Gayle.

Many of you will know Karen, our HCA. Karen left us at Christmas. Those of you who knew her will remember her for her larger than life character so she too will be greatly missed. However, she is working for the Dermatology Service who run some clinics from the Centre and so, you may still be fortunate enough to see her around. We have increased the nursing team with the addition of Kelly. We hope that you will join us in welcoming Gayle and Kelly to the practice.

Pre-Booked and Urgent Access Appointments

Some patients will remember that, at the beginning of 2014, we changed our afternoon Urgent Access system. Amongst the changes that were made the afternoon clinic changed from being one where our patients came in and were seen on a 'sit and wait' basis to one where they would be called back by a clinician.

This has proved to be very successful and popular with our patients for the following reasons:

- It enabled us to offer a greater number of pre-bookable appointments meaning that the waiting times, for these appointments decreased.
- This urgent access system means that, if the issue can be dealt with on the phone (e.g. sick notes, prescriptions etc), then it saves them the time and inconvenience of having to come into the practice.
- Should the clinician decide that you need to be seen and have to come into the practice then they can will give you an appointment there and then with the most appropriate clinician.



We have found that, for these reasons, this system has worked better for our patients, the clinicians and the practice as a whole. As a result, we have decided that, starting on 1st July 2015, we are going to extend this to the morning urgent access clinic.

Therefore, after this date, if you have an urgent medical condition, you should phone the surgery, on the main number 01234 762500, rather than attending the practice in person.

Patients should phone after 08:15am if they need to see a clinician urgently and leave: Their name; a contact number and; a brief description of the problem. A clinician will call back later in the morning in order to assess your needs and determine the most appropriate course of action. If appropriate you will be asked to attend the practice and given a time later in the day.

SMS Text Service and Online Services

We are pleased to announce that the SMS messaging service, that we advised was being introduced in the previous *Wootton News*, has proved to be very successful and popular with our patients. This enables us to send out a text message the day before to remind you of your upcoming appointment. This has had the effect that it has significantly reduced the number of people who do not attend their appointment. This benefits us all, as it avoids wasting clinicians' time and this, in turn, means that the waiting times for appointments are reduced.

We are looking to expand the number of services for which we use SMS messaging for the benefit of our patients. We are generally looking at increasing the number of online services available to you.

New Bus

We are delighted to announce, for those who are unaware, that there is a new bus service serving Wootton. This is the number 53 and it goes right past the practice and even stops outside! Even better still is that the service goes to both Bedford and Milton Keynes Hospitals!

We will, of course, continue to reflect upon our practice to ensure that the best possible learning experience is offered to all the children in our care.

The Easter Eggstravaganza fund raising event was once again a resounding success, raising over £200 and being very well attended by Bizzy Bees children old and new. A big thank you to everybody who supported the event – great fun was had by all!!!

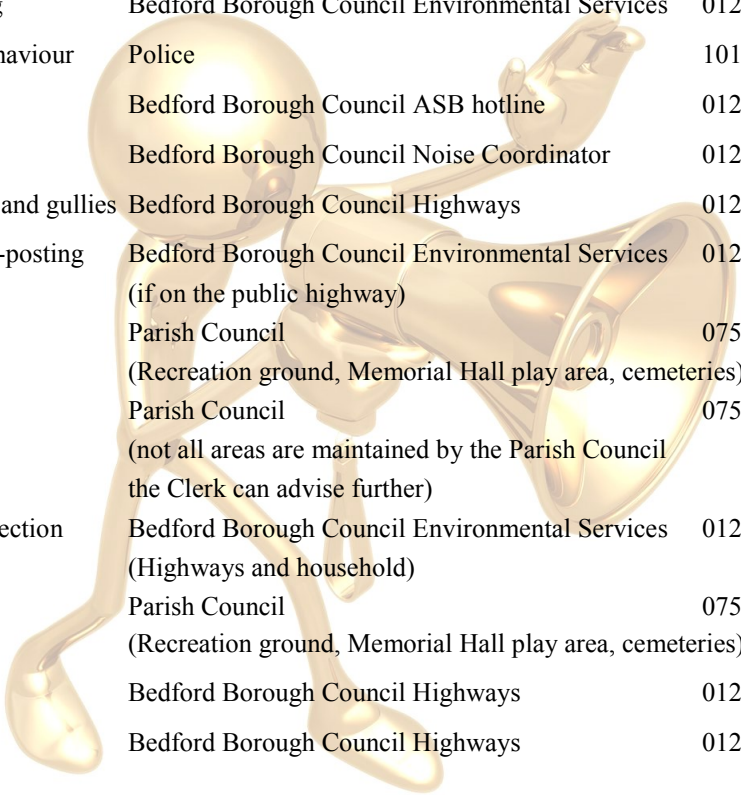

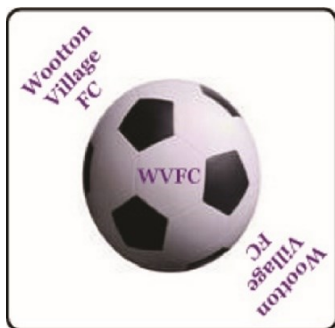

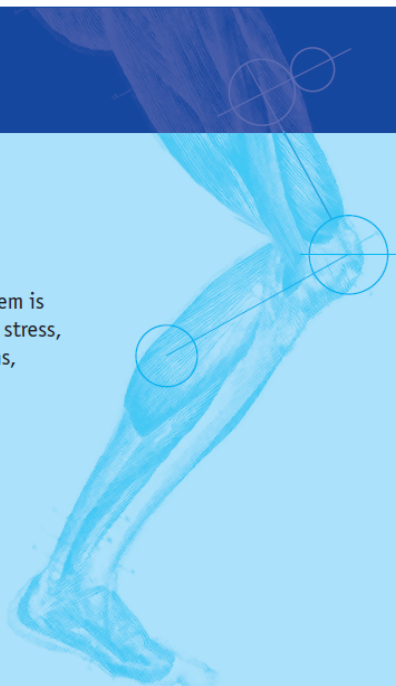
